North Beckton Joins the Trust!

On 1st April 2019 we welcome North Beckton Primary School into The Tapscott Learning Trust. The Trust has been working very successfully in





partnership and supporting North Beckton since Spring 2017. At the school's last HMI visit in May 2018, the Inspector, Mr Brian Oppenheim, especially noted that considerable improvements had been achieved at the school with the support of The Tapscott Learning Trust.

At the start of this academic year, Governors at North Beckton commenced the formal consultation process to seek the views of its parents, carers, staff and the local community on the proposal to convert to an academy and to join TTLT. Governors then received a final report on this consultation and took the decision in January 2019 that the conversion should proceed, and this was agreed by the Department of Education.

We very much welcome North Beckton into our family of four schools joining Curwen, Kensington and Ranelagh!

Pupil Parliament Corner

As part of their work this term, the Pupil Parliament attended WE Day 2019, a celebration of young people making a difference in their local and global communities and this event was also
