The Newham PSHE partnership has run for the last three years providing support to Newham schools in order to comply with the new statutory guidance for RSHE (DfE, 2019). This year we are opening up our partnership offer to schools outside of Newham who are seeking high quality support around PSHE.

This brochure gives you the details of programmes and CPD opportunities we will be providing for schools across the academic year 2022-23.

You can choose to join the partnership which will give you access to all our free sessions. This price would be £840 for the year for school with under 500 pupils. £1000 for schools with over 501 pupils.

Approved DfE provider for RSHE CPD to schools – the partnership will provide on-going access to the DfE training resources for RSHE via a Google link sent to partnership schools.


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Headteacher's Briefing

Secondary PSHE Network Meeting

This year we are separating out our traditional 3 hour network meetings each term into a 2 hr network meeting and a 1 hr master-class. This is to allow for more PSHE/RSHE leaders to attend from all our secondary schools.

PSHE network meetings are run to give an opportunity to bring together PSHE leaders and teachers within secondary schools to meet, network and work collaboratively on projects, helping in middle manager responsibilities.

Network meetings will:

- Update subject leaders on Local and National information;
- Help subject leaders understand their role and responsibilities within school;
- Share best practice models and examples in PSHE/RSHE; and
- Work with outside agencies to support schools in delivering high quality PSHE/RSHE.

Internal & external compliancy reviews of RSHE

The PSHE Partnership (previously the RSHE Partnership) has spent the last two years preparing schools to effectively deliver RSHE as stipulated by the DfE Statutory Guidance from the DfE. Most schools are doing an amazing job at teaching this new curriculum, but may still feel that they want to ensure that their policy, curriculum content, parent engagement and the confidence and ability of staff to teach RSHE are compliant with the guidance. To support schools in this The Partnership are able to supply schools with three levels of review. Documents have been devised, by way of:

- A questionnaire for pupils 1.
- A questionnaire for the RSHE Lead 2.
- A compliance matrix (which outlines curriculum are 3. as that should be taught and how teaching should be carried out)

There are three levels of review that can be carried out in schools.

1. Basic Internal review

Providing documents for a school to carry out their own compliance review.

These will be licensed to individual schools and should not be shared, even with in MATS.

Cost: £150

2. Supported internal review

Documents provided and then worked through with the Advisor to ensure compliance with the statutory and additional guidance. Support and advice given where needed.

Cost: £350 for half day £650 whole day

Any additional time needed will be charged at £250 a half day

3. Independent external review

This will include the above, but also a website, policy and curriculum review, pupil consultations, book look and staff discussion. A written report can also be commissioned.

Cost: Bespoke prices arranged depending on the size of the school and the amount of support needed

Faith & Student Sensitive Training

Understanding Domestic Violence Training

- 11 in 5 teenagers have been physically abused by their boyfriend or girlfriend (NSPCC, 2009)
- Newham has the second highest rate of domestic abuse in London
- 2 women are murdered every week in the UK by a partner or ex-partner
- Young people 16-24 are at greatest risk of experiencing domestic violence
- Young people who witness or are the victims of domestic violence are more likely to join gangs

Newham has the second highest level of domestic violence in London and pupils say that negative relationships are a concern for them. This training will support teachers to find some of the ways to tackle these issues effectively in your schools, either through PSHE, drama, or in a cross curricular approach.

Delivered by the Newham PSHE Partnership team with Tender, an acclaimed charity working with schools across London.

The session will include:

- Up to date statistics and information on domestic violence and it's effects on children and young people
- Bespoke primary strategies and pedagogies for delivering this difficult subject in primary schools
- Bespoke secondary strategies and pedagogies for delivering this difficult subject in secondary schools
- support teachers to find some of the ways to tackle these issues in schools, through PSHE, drama, or in a cross curricular approach.

Once a course or training has been booked with the partnership a confirmation e-mail will be sent to the school. An invoice will be sent to the school after the training/course has been completed.

In the case of cancellation the following charges will be applied:
