Secondary R/PSHE Network Meeting

For the new academic year we are going to run our network meetings in a new way. We will have an annual one-day conference and a termly one hour on-line update session.

This will provide for schools all that we have provided before but in a new way - which we hope will mean more schools to be able to attend.

Network meetings will:

- Update subject leaders on Local and National information;
- Help subject leaders understand their role and responsibilities within school;
- Share best practice models and examples in R/PSHE; and
- Work with outside agencies to provide short CPD sessions, supporting schools in delivering high quality R/PSHE.

R/PSHE Masterclasses

The training that the partnership has offered over the last six years has always been recorded. When in partnership you can gain free access to this training library on our google drive.

The master-classes offer CPD for all teachers who help to deliver R/PSHE across your school. They are available via our google drive for any teacher to access and learn from experts in different fields of the R/PSHE curriculum.

They always reflect and react to any local or national agendas, issues or needs that become obvious, to ensure that teachers in Newham schools can stay up to date with whatever is current in the area of R/PSHE.

Each masterclass will last for 50 minutes to one hour. There are always at least three produced every academic year.

Internal & External Compliancy Reviews of RSHE

The Newham PSHE Partnership has spent the last five years preparing schools to effectively deliver RSHE as stipulated by the DfE Statutory Guidance (2019 and now 2025). Most schools are doing an amazing job at teaching this new curriculum, but may still feel that they want to ensure that their policy, curriculum content, parent engagement and the confidence and ability of staff to teach RSHE are compliant with the guidance.

Part of the review will look at the new guidance and support with the implementation, look at Ofsted expectations, personal development and wellbeing and how PSHE contributes to whole school ethos and impact.

To support schools in this The Partnership are able to supply schools with three levels of review. Documents have been devised, by way of:

1. A questionnaire for pupils
2. A questionnaire for the RSHE Lead
3. A compliance matrix (which outlines curriculum that should be taught and how teaching should be carried out)

There are three levels of review that can be carried out in schools.

1. Basic Internal review

Providing documents for a school to carry out their own compliance review.

These will be licensed to individual schools and should not be shared, even with in MATS.

2. Supported internal review

Documents provided and then worked through with an Advisor to ensure compliance with the statutory and additional guidance. Support and advice given where needed.

**Cost: £350 for half day
£650 whole day**

Any additional time needed will be charged at £250 a half day

3. Independent external review

This will include the above, but also a website, policy and curriculum review, pupil consultations, book look and staff discussion. A written report can also be commissioned.

Cost: Bespoke prices arranged depending on the size of the school and the amount of support needed



New to Newham: *Contextualising the context for teaching high quality R/PSHE*

Teachers notes:

These videos were developed by parents for parents.

These parent films come in sections of video with parents talking. The transcripts for each section are written out so you can refer to them during the activities or discussions that form part of the parent workshops. It is up to you, how much or how little you do in each section and also what sections you use with parents and how long you spend delivering these workshops with parents.

Whilst it is important that each individual school decides for themselves how they carry out these workshops, it was found, during the pilot for the workshops, that that it might be wise to split workshop one into two sessions if you are going to give plenty of time to the activities and the discussions.

Most text here are notes for the teacher facilitator, however anything underlined is a suggested script you might want to use and anything in *italics* are the transcripts of the videos.

When preparing for these workshops:

- It is worth targeting the parents you really want to attend as well as getting parents involved who you think will have the confidence to encourage others to come along.
- If possible provide drinks and biscuits or fruit and make the space as welcoming as

The workshops were very popular and the parents and carers who attended appreciated the opportunity to hear about the importance of PSHE and RSHE from other parents' perspectives. The workshops facilitated the opportunity for participants to discuss any concerns or fears they may have had around PSHE or RSHE and how it is taught in school. This meant that opportunities for good communication between school and parents in this area could be established, promoted and/or consolidated. We think that the workshops would be great to use during policy consultations and with new parents and carers at the start of each new academic year."*

Payment and Cancellation Procedure

Once a course or training has been booked with the partnership a confirmation e-mail will be sent to the school. An invoice will be sent to the school after the training/course has been completed.

In the case of cancellation the following charges will be applied:

24 hours or less notice of cancellation - Full cost of course
25-72 hours notice of cancellation - 60% of full course fee
3-5 days notice of cancellation - 40% of full course fee



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
