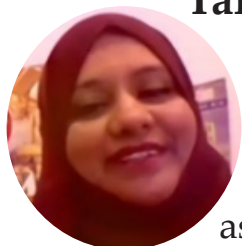


Catriona has had school leadership responsibility for the well-being of pupils, parents and staff. She is passionate about helping young people to work together to become the best versions of themselves.

Staff CPD Twilight Sessions

One hour to 1.5 hours training available to your staff team

Session 1: Thoughtful RE

This twilight will give staff confidence to reflect on the types of questions they ask when teaching RE, and will give them practical, usable resources for ensuring high order thinking skills are being used in their RE teaching from EYFS to KS1 & KS2.

Session 2: Outstanding RE

This twilight will give staff the opportunity to understand the purpose of RE. Providing support around progression in RE as well as providing plenty of inspirational tasks for staff to use.

Session 3: Creative RE

This twilight focuses on using a wide range of creative pedagogies to teach RE with. It seeks to strengthen teachers ability to plan for RE in cross curricular ways, helping to raise standards in RE.

Visit a Place of Worship

Visit a place of worship takes place throughout the academic year. RE Matters seeks to encourage RE learning outside the classroom through supporting schools to organise visits to local places of worship.

ECT Training

Training for ECTs is imperative if staff are to have the knowledge and skills to teach religious education well in Newham. If your school is not part of the Boleyn Trust ECT-programme then RE Matters offers these half day training.

Staff & Pupil Wellbeing Sessions

Claire Clinton and Lucy Still lead these sessions which are proving popular with schools across Newham. Sessions or lessons can focus on staff or on pupils or a combination of both. Our work with schools is bespoke. The sessions last from 1 hour to 1.5 hours.

Session 1: Why staff wellbeing is important

This twilight will give staff an understanding of the pressures encountered in their work life and how these play out. It will give staff practical activities they use in their lives to ensure they can live their life in education well, but learn how to switch off.

Session 2: Successful strategies to enable pupil wellbeing

This twilight will give staff understanding and experience of successful strategies that work for pupils to help them become more emotionally resilient.

Session 3: Modelling Stilling

This lesson would model for teachers how to work well with pupils to help them become more emotionally resilient and enhance their well being. This in turn supports pupils to be able to engage with their learning effectively in schools.

Infant RE Conferences

These one day conferences bring together in 2024, 18 schools at a time to work philosophically together. Around rich RE knowledge. They seek to:

- **Promote dialogue** between pupils of differing faiths and secular backgrounds;
- **Provide reflection on British Values** around the issue of tolerance and respect;
- **Provide professional development for middle managers or teachers** as they watch another teacher lead the learning and then go on to create their own conference back at their school with more pupils; and
- **Provide an opportunity for higher achieving pupils** to be stretched in their RE thinking.



- Seeing P4C in action allowed me to see how I could use it at school. When we think of philosophy it seems daunting, but this day made it clearer. It was also grate to see how you scaffolded the children's questions. I like how you turned their 'good ideas' into questions that would require a greater depth of thinking;
- I had an amazing experience observing P4C. The cross curricular links throughout the day were helpful in identifying appropriate subject areas to implement P4C; and

Payment and Cancellation Procedure
