My Story - Kate Shurety

I've been involved in The Tapscott Learning Trust before it became a Trust, so long ago in fact that I can't remember the year. Back in 2002 or 2003 my daughter was a pupil at Curwen Primary School. I was working full time at Newham Council and as a single parent was not often at the school gate picking her up or dropping her off. So I was keen to get involved in the school as a governor. I became an LEA governor (appointed by the Local Authority) and served since then until she was doing her A levels!

I loved the school, she got so much from it, and also just seeing all the children over the years go on and do great things too. The school really set them up to set their sights and ambitions high – and gave them the tools to get there.

So, after a break of a couple of years, when I was approached to become a Trustee of the new Trust, I was keen to get involved again; this time with Kensington, Ranelagh and North Beckton too. Turkey- Syria Eathquake

In February, areas of Turkey and Syria were devastated by an earthquake that shocked the world. The impact on so many lives and the needs of those in the areas affected had a huge impact on our communities. As always, everyone at the trust wanted to help and each of our school's flew into action to raise money. Despite the increased cost of living pressures, an amazing £2,500 was raised!!

Since the earthquake, Mr Shaba Ali, one of Curwen's parents and governors, who works for local charity One Ummah (meaning community in Arabic) has had one of his busiest months ever, working with his team to fundraise. Event such as a football tournament and collections at local Mosques have all contributed to the charity raising an impressive £4million with this money being split between the relief effort in both Turkey and Syria.

We really are so lucky to have such amazing communities to work with!
