Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

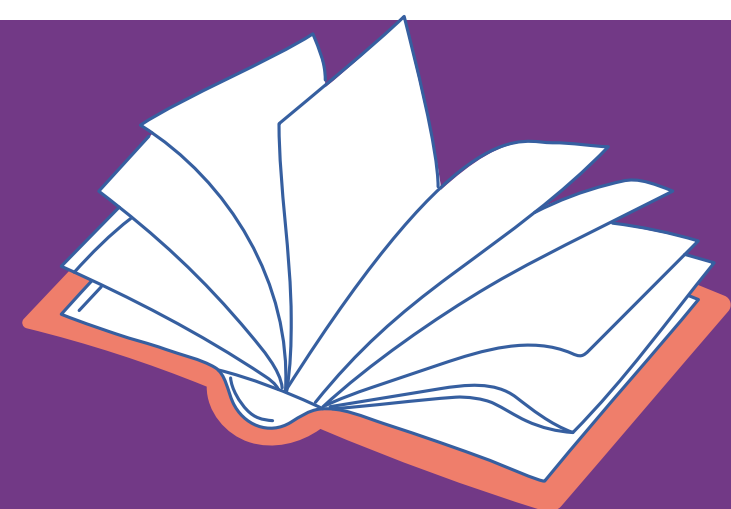


This has been another fantastic term which, although shorter than others, has been jam packed with different events at all of our schools and we hope that this newsletter gives you a flavour of what we have been doing.

Radia Bensafi is a committed and dedicated mother of four who has been on the Ranelagh journey for the last 10 years. Radia's journey started with Ranelagh when her son joined EYFS

Who are you?

My name is Radia Bensafi and I am a parent of four children who have all attended Ranelagh primary school. I live in the local area and have lots of love for the school and all the staff there.

What is good about Ranelagh?

When my son started school, I didn't know that my child had needs until the school helped me get him assessed for Autism. I am so grateful to the school for doing this as they supported me in finding resources for his needs. I also love the PTA. I have been part of this for nearly 8 years. I am a link member for events at the school so am very busy organising events with Mrs Sheikh. I also help out with school trips, parents evenings and sometimes translate for other parents who speak arabic. Last month I completed a family course called Nutrition Kitchen. In this course, I was able to cook every week with my family and also do exercise. It was brilliant and free too. I also brought my neighbours with me who couldn't speak English and wanted to learn about healthy foods.

Turkey- Syria Earthquake

In February, areas of Turkey and Syria were devastated by an earthquake that shocked the world. The impact on so many lives and the needs of those in the areas affected had a huge impact on our communities. As always, everyone at the trust wanted to help and each of our school's flew into action to raise money. Despite the increased cost of living pressures, an amazing £2,500 was raised!!

Since the earthquake, Mr Shaba Ali, one of Curwen's parents and governors, who works for local charity One Ummah (meaning community in Arabic) has had one of his busiest months ever, working with his team to fundraise. Event such as a football tournament and collections at local Mosques have all contributed to the charity raising an impressive £4million with this money being split between the relief effort in both Turkey and Syria.

We really are so lucky to have such amazing communities to work with!



SPIRIT IN MOTION



'Spirit in Motion' is our fully inclusive sports programme aimed to develop the sports provision in our Trust Schools. Working closely with our SENCo's in each school, we offer a variety of opportunities to develop the physical, social and emotional wellbeing of all pupils. The offer includes weekly swimming and water safety lessons for each school at Atherton and East Ham Leisure Centres and two trips to Fairplay House. In addition, and working in partnership with Panathlon, we also held a 10-pin bowling competition at the O2, a multi skills festival at Newham Leisure Centre and a swimming gala at the Aquatics Centre. To support this work, Helen Harris and Paul Belcher have delivered training and practical workshops to UEL students who in return support children in our schools.
