We have had an amazing response from parents and pupils across the 3 schools from the surveys in May 2018.

We would like to thank you for completing the survey and for all your comments and suggestions which have been greatly received and will help us in making the Tapscott Learning Trust even better for parents, pupils and staff.

98% of parents and children have said their children enjoy school and feel they are well supported by the school on many levels and are able to go to members of staff about any concerns.

It was great to see the response on extra curricular/after school club activities. 76% of children across the MAT attend at least 1 or more extra curricular/after school clubs and are thoroughly enjoying them!

Pupil Parliament 2017/18




Thank you to all the pupils that served in the Pupil Parliament this year.
