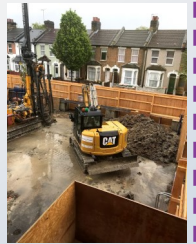
TTLT Planned Building and Upgrading Work

Major building work is being undertaken at Ranelagh, with the first phase already being completed. The building project is due to be completed by April 2020 which will add a large extension to the existing building.

In the summer holidays, North Beckton will be scheduled for some major building work including roof work, extensive improvements to the PMLD provision, a new art studio and relocation of the PPA room.

Curwen has now ordered the new double decker bus which will be a sensory space, located in the playground, and ready for use early in 2020.

At Kensington over the summer holidays, there will be major improvement work to the water system.
